Dear Friends,

2021 was a year of various humanitarian challenges for the children of the Middle East. First, the Covid-19 pandemic continued to divert limited resources in already overstretched public health systems and the marginalized communities that depend on them; economic growth and development remained stagnant and, in some cases, even recessive, limiting access to health care. Then, in May, the two million-plus people living in the Gaza Strip endured 11-days of bombings that destroyed infrastructure and injured and killed hundreds of civilians.

On May 12, the main PCRF office in Gaza City was destroyed, although thankfully, no one was hurt. Despite these enormous challenges, we continued to provide hundreds of children with medical care that they otherwise could not get through our One-Time Sponsorship program.

In addition, we provided support for sick children in our two pediatric cancer departments, which we opened in 2013 in Beit Jala and 2019 in Gaza. In 2021, we continued building our two main infrastructure

projects at the Palestine Medical Complex in Ramallah- a new pediatric ICU and cardiology department. Both are planned to open in the first half of 2022 and will begin helping the children of Palestine.

In addition, in 2021, we opened a new NICU in Jenin Hospital, among other projects throughout the West Bank. In Gaza, thousands of children affected by war and closure, COVID, poverty, and other factors received urgent humanitarian relief. In Lebanon's camps, we provided food for thousands of refugees impacted by the economic and political crisis.

In 2022, PCRF plans to continue to focus on the urgent humanitarian needs of children and the long-term development of the public health sector. As a grassroots non-profit, your support makes our work possible. We hope that you will continue to support our relief efforts in 2022 as we work to address the humanitarian needs of children in the Levant.

Volunteer Medical Missions

Our Medical Missions Program was suspended in early 2020 due to the rapid spread of COVID-19 that has placed significant and increasing restrictions on the travel of people all over the world, within countries, and across borders. Despite these challenging circumstances, we managed to support 9 medical missions to the Gaza Strip and Jordan that screened 415 cases and treated 318 needy patients.



In 2021 we were able to continue to support the building of a vascular and kidney transplant program. Thirty-three kidney transplant operations were performed at Shifa Hospital in



One-time Surgical Sponsorship

Each week we identify children who need surgery in Lebanon's refugee camps and Jordan, who are going without care due to the lack of access to treatment for financial reasons. We procure hospitals to get reduced prices and save lives. In 2021, due to the inability of PCRF to bring medical missions to the West Bank due to COVID-19, we added the West Bank to the program. In spite of the challenges, and thanks to our many donors, over 800 children received surgery through this sponsorship program.

Humanitarian Programs and Projects

For 30 years, we have been helping children in the Middle East through a wide variety of humanitarian programs and projects. 2021 was a year of an even greater urgency in responding with effective humanitarian interventions due to conditions on the ground, especially in Gaza following May's aggressions. The following humanitarian programs and projects outline our support for children in the Middle East.



One-time Medical Sponsorship

Each week we appeal to our donor community to sponsor children in the Middle East in need of medicine, medical care or other humanitarian support that they cannot get locally. In 2021, we sponsored 860 children in need of one-time sponsorship.

Gaza Mental Health Program

Due to the ongoing exposure to violence and trauma, as well as poverty and the closure of Gaza, Gaza's one-million children suffer a high rate of mental health issues and needs. Gaza's women and children are the most vulnerable members of society. Following the 55-day bombing of Gaza in 2014, PCRF set up a mental health program under our medical advisory board to put together a team on the ground to provide effective interventions for target groups, such as children in our pediatric cancer and amputee programs. Our team in 2021 supported and treated 766 children from all over the Gaza Strip, providing group and individual therapy sessions, peer support group sessions, and family support through home visits.

Monthly Disabled Child Sponsorship

In 2000, we launched a monthly sponsorship program for chronically disabled or ill children whose families were unable to provide them basic medical support. In 2021, our monthly child sponsorship program supported 834 children and 9 Syrian/Gaza families, this included

Gaza orphans, and other children. This program is thanks to the hundreds of monthly sponsors throughout the year who provide support to these children on the ground. We also partner with the Zakat Foundation to help provide hundreds of Gaza orphans sponsorship.

For over ten years, PCRF has been sponsoring summer camps for different target groups. Following the May aggression on Gaza, we organized five summer camps for 80 children with cancer, a second "Camp Ability" for 80

Two years ago we launched a humanitarian initiative to support amputee children in Gaza by providing them psychosocial support and medical care at Hamad Hospital for Rehabilitation and Prosthetics. In 2021, 109 amputees benefited from this program. Our Pediatric Cancer Departments

Before we opened the first public pediatric cancer department in Palestine in 2013, every child with oncological and hematological disease had to travel away from their families outside of the West Bank and Gaza Strip for medical care. Thanks to our donors all over the world, we have built, and continue to support, two pediatric oncological centers of excellence in which hundreds of children have free access to cancer care near their families and communities.





Huda Al Masri Pediatric Cancer Department

In 2013 we opened Palestine's first and only public pediatric cancer department named after our founding head social worker Huda Al Masri, whose dedication, hard work, and leadership helped to build PCRF for 17 years until she passed away from leukemia in 2009. Since then, hundreds of children have had life-saving surgery for free in the department. In 2021, we supported child-life service and other humanitarian aid for patients and their families, and in September we opened a new wing of the department to enable expansion of care. In 2021, 1,141 children were helped: 200 inpatient and 941 outpatients, while 685 other patients had clinical medical care.

Dr. Musa and Suhaila Nasir Pediatric Cancer Department

In 2019 we opened the first and only pediatric cancer department in Gaza, named in honor of two co-founding members, Dr. Musa and Suhaila Nasir.

In 2021, 246 children had treatment in the department. We also began offering dental health care for patients and treated 145 children through 429 procedures.



Chemotherapy

In 2021, we purchased \$146,000 worth of chemotherapy drugs to help offset shortages in the hospital stores. This reduced the referral of many children outside for care.

Nutrition

s the health system in Gaza does not provide food for inpatients, we partnered with other charities to sponsor three meals daily for the children during their treatment.

COVID 19 and protection measures

We supplied Personal Protective Equipment and supplies (PPE's) to ensure patient and staff safety and bridge the gap caused by the shortage of supplies by MOH.
